## PeopleLikeUs – E17 Art Trail 2012

*'bestow' giftwraps the invitation from over 3,500 practicing artists and creative contributors, an invitation to enjoy the vision, relish the gifts and to consider the ideas of our flourishing creative community. E17 Art Trail 2012*

**the drawing shed** artists present a public exhibition, a live participatory performance, and a Pop Up Cinema. Funded by Arts Council England with Hoe Street Community First, Walthamstow & Chingford Almshouse Charity and Ascham Homes, this project is organised in collaboration with E17 residents and in partnership with arts organisations as part of the E17 Art Trail: a unique and exciting 16 days of artist-led events (1st -16th September 2012).

Under the banner **PeopleLikeUs**, artists Sally Labern and Bobby Lloyd create and curate a Public Signage project, a Live Twitter performance based on the E17 Art Trail's theme for 2012, '**bestow**', and **Morning, Noon and Night** - an all day pop-up cinema.

**the drawing shed** is a non-profit arts organisation based in Walthamstow, East London, led by visual artists/directors Sally Labern and Bobby Lloyd. Its three mobile studios – **the drawing shed**, **ClayOven** and **PrintBike** – were established in 2009 as an artist-led project/resource/collaboration and form one of the central platforms for Labern+Lloyds creative practice. The mobiles live in **the drawing shed's** garage/lock-ups on The Drive housing estate E17, from where the artists currently run socially engaged projects both on the local estates and across London.
